Mr. Edward P. Huntington

Labotville

Hadley June 7th 1843.

Dear Edward, I am enjoying the company of our
Boston friends very much - and hope to see you to-
day at N. with your wife - but as this is
uncertain, I write this to send by Mr. B. - in case you
do not come - I also shall carry over a bottle of
butter, &c. for you. - Father and I went on the
sabbath to Deerfield with F. and H. - were most
kindly received at noon at Doctor Williams' - with
Theophilus and his wife, and refreshed with a
cup of tea, and with usual accompaniments -
next sabbath your father Throden and his wife
intend to hear F. preach at Deerfield.

Frederic thinks, probably if you do not meet
us at N. today, that he shall call on you
next week either before, or on Thursday or Friday
when they intend to return to Boston.

It is near 9 and I must make ready to
attend the ordination; we are all going -
most affectionately your
mother. Elizabeth
